RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK TOWN SUPERVISOR TO ACCEPT A REDUCED PERFORMANCE BOND FOR THE WEST DORSEY CONSTRUCTION ACCESS PORTION OF THE INN AT BELLEFIELD ROJECT

WHEREAS, the applicant, T-Rex Hyde Park Owner LLC, has received conditional site plan approval for Sub-Phase 1-A of the approved Concept Plan for the St. Andrew’s Planned Unit Development, consisting of a 5-Story 133 guest room hotel located near the intersection of Albany Post Road and West Dorsey Lane, tax parcel no. 6163-01-131849, together with the first phase of a proposed wastewater treatment plant and other infrastructure improvements to serve the hotel (the “Property”); and

WHEREAS, as a condition of using West Dorsey Lane for construction access to the Project, the Planning Board required:

Approval by the Town Board of a performance guaranty in an amount approved by the Town Engineer and Planning Board in form, substance, and manner of execution acceptable to the Town Attorney to secure the obligation to complete much of the work listed in the estimate included in the July 26, 2019 memorandum from Town Engineer Peter Setaro as determined necessary by the Town Highway Superintendent and NYS Department of Transportation, including a 2” compacted overlay, replacement of signal loops, sealing of existing cracks, and other associated work listed in the estimate on that portion of West Dorsey Lane between the WDCA and US Route 9 to the satisfaction of the Highway Superintendent, and in the posting of such bond; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board, by Resolution dated August 7, 2019, amended the conditions of site plan approval to require the following:

Completion of the work listed in the estimate included in the July 26, 2019 memorandum from Town Engineer Peter Setaro, as determined necessary by the Town Highway Superintendent and NYS Department of Transportation, including a 2” compacted overlay, replacement of signal loops, sealing of existing cracks, and other associated work listed in the estimate, on that portion of West Dorsey Lane between the WDCA and US Route 9, to the satisfaction of the Highway Superintendent. In the event that completion of any portion of the work described in this paragraph is not possible solely because of seasonal closure of the asphalt plant, and the

Applicant has satisfied all other conditions of CO issuance, the CO shall be issued based on the previously filed Performance Security, and the Applicant shall complete such work as soon as the asphalt plant reopens. The extended time for performance based on closure of the asphalt plants shall in no event exceed six months from the issuance of the CO. The Performance Guarantee shall not be released until the Highway Superintendent and the Town Engineer have advised that the required work described herein has been satisfactorily completed; and

WHEREAS, the applicant provided the Planning Board with a bond estimate prepared by Chazen Associates dated July 22, 2019, which recommended a bond amount of \$54,200.80 to cover the restoration of West Dorsey Lane as described above; and

WHEREAS, the Town Engineer reviewed the applicant's estimate and by memorandum dated July 26, 2019, recommended to the Planning Board that the bond be set at \$60,000; and

WHEREAS, the applicant's counsel provided a proposed Security Agreement to guarantee completion of the repairs to West Dorsey Lane performed, acceptable to the Attorney to the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Security Agreement was secured by a Performance Bond posted by the contractor, PC Construction Company d/b/a PCEO, Inc., NY, in the amount of \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, conditions of approval set forth in the Planning Board Resolution were modified by the Planning Board on June 20, 2018, April 17, 2019 and August 7, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has partially completed the restoration with the exception of a wetland repair where the utilities cross the entrance north of the primary entrance to Route 9; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has requested the Planning Board to approve a reduction in the Restoration Bond; and

WHEREAS, the Town Engineer has reviewed said request by Memorandum dated April 2, 2021 and has indicated that he has no objection to the bond being reduced to \$10,000; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board, by Resolution dated April 7, 2021, recommends that the Town Board reduce the Performance Guarantee for the site

restoration to \$10,000 in a form, substance, and manner of execution to the Town Board and Attorney to the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to accept an amended, reduced Performance Bond in the amount of \$10,000 in a form, substance, and manner of execution acceptable to the Attorney to the Town.

WHEREAS, the Town has applied for, and received, a CDBG Block Grant pursuant to the Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus and the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act to fund activities to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the Coronavirus for purposes of making certain senior center-related safety improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Town has been awarded a CDBG Special Block Grant in the amount of \$29,500 for such improvements which will include the purchase of equipment to support the safe opening of the municipality’s senior center and technology upgrades to provide virtual access at the center, together with related equipment which includes, but shall not be limited to, tents, air purifiers, plexiglas barriers, UV-C lights, laptops and wi-fi upgrades; and

WHEREAS, the County has submitted to the Town a proposed agreement between the Town and Dutchess County for the said Block Grant project; and

WHEREAS, the agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Attorney to the Town and the Town Comptroller.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby authorizes the Town Supervisor to accept said funding and execute the 2020 CDBG-CV Block Grant Agreement with Dutchess County for the Town of Hyde Park Recreation Department’s Senior Center COVID-Related Safety Improvements in the same, or substantially similar form as submitted to the Town by Dutchess County.

WHEREAS, the Town of Hyde Park Forest Drive Landfill was capped in 2005 in accordance with DEC rules and regulations, and the Town is required to implement a post-closure monitoring program approved by DEC which includes ground water quality and methane gas sampling; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Hyde Park is required to conduct and prepare quarterly monitoring reports for landfill gas that are sent to DEC and the Town along with an annual report; and

WHEREAS, Clark, Patterson, Lee has submitted a proposal for providing water quality monitoring services for the Forest Drive Landfill dated April 26, 2021 which provides, in relevant part, for a continuation of the past landfill monitoring services provided by Clark, Patterson, Lee at a cost not to exceed \$7,500; and

WHEREAS, the proposal has been reviewed by the Town of Hyde Park Town Board and Town Comptroller, of which both have determined that the proposal is fair and reasonable; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds provided for in the Town's 2021 budget to provide for the cost of said monitoring services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Hyde Park Town Board does hereby authorize the Town Supervisor to accept the 2021 landfill monitoring proposal with Clark, Patterson, Lee for Hyde Park Forest Drive, at a total cost not to exceed \$7,500 for a contract term effective January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK TOWN SUPERVISOR TO EXECUTE A LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK AND STAR2STAR FOR A NEW PHONE SYSTEM FOR THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK OFFICES AND FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the phone system for the Town’s offices and facilities has exceeded its useful life and has greatly impacted the conduct of town business on and off for several years now due to the constant interruption of service and line interference; and

WHEREAS, the Town’s Comptroller received various quotes according to the Town’s Procurement Policy; and

WHEREAS, the Comptroller’s Office obtained a quote for a new phone system through a representative from Professional Computer Associates which will be leased through the company Star2Star; and

WHEREAS, the new phone system after initial installation and service fees will be a 60 month lease agreement with a monthly cost of \$1,511.00 and will replace the Town’s current monthly charges for Verizon and AT & T and will only cost the Town roughly an additional \$500.00 more per month; and

WHEREAS, both the Town Supervisor, Town Board, and Town Comptroller are in agreement that the equipment and services for a new phone system provided by Star2Star is in the best interests of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Hyde Park Town Board does hereby authorize the Town Supervisor to execute any and all documents in regards to said lease agreement with Star2Star for the new phone system for the Town of Hyde Park Offices and facilities in the same, or substantially the same form, as presented to, and approved by, the Attorney to the Town and the Town Comptroller.
