RESOLUTION ADOPTING LOCAL LAW NO. K OF THE YEAR 2021 ENTITLED: "A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND §104-16(A)(1) OF THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK CODE TO CREATE A FOUR-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF OLD POST ROAD AND RIVER ROAD AND MULFORD AVENUE"

WHEREAS, Old Post Road, River Road and Mulford Avenue are Town maintained highways; and

WHEREAS, there currently exists a four-way intersection at the western terminus of River Road and Old Post Road and the eastern terminus of Mulford Avenue and Old Post Road; and

WHEREAS, there currently exists stop signs at the western terminus of River Road where it intersects with Old Post Road and at the eastern terminus of Mulford Avenue where it intersects with Old Post Road; and

WHEREAS, the Hyde Park Police Chief advised the Town Board that for

matters of traffic safety, that intersection should be a four-way stop rather than a two-way stop; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a four-way stop at this intersection has been supported by the Town's Highway Superintendent; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney to the Town prepared a local law effecting the above-referenced amendments to §104-16(A)(1) of the Town Code; and

WHEREAS, the proposed local law is a Type II action for purposes of the State Environmental Quality Review Act which does not require SEQRA review; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board scheduled a public hearing on the adoption of Local Law No. K of the Year 2021 on November 1, 2021, at 6:05 p.m. at the Hyde Park Town Hall and closed the public hearing on that same date; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the adoption of said Local Law is in the best interests of the Town and citizens.

LOCAL LAW NO. K OF THE YEAR 2021

A LOCAL LAW TO AMEND §104-16(A)(1) OF THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK CODE TO CREATE A FOUR-WAY STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF OLD POST ROAD AND RIVER ROAD AND MULFORD AVENUE

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Hyde Park as follows:

SECTION 1:

Section 104-16(A)(1) of the Hyde Park Town Code is hereby amended to delete the references to Old Post Road at Mulford Avenue and Old Post Road at

River Road and to add the following to the list of streets in proper alphabetical order:

- Old Post Road at the intersection of River Road and Mulford Avenue (Four-way stop signs)

SECTION 2: SEVERABILITY.

In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this article is held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalid or unconstitutional portions of this article shall be deemed severed from the article and shall in no way affect the validity of the rest of this article.”

SECTION 3: SUPERSESION.

This local law is hereby adopted pursuant to the provisions of RPTL §487, §10 of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law and §10 of the New York State Statute of Local Governments. It is the intent of the Town Board to supersede any provisions of the New York State Law to the extent that they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Local Law.

SECTION 4: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the Office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the municipal Home Rule Law.

WHEREAS, the Town Board had requested the Attorney to the Town to prepare a local law appropriately amending Section 70-3(E) of the Town Code to comply with the request of the Division of Criminal Justice Services; and

WHEREAS, the Attorney to the Town prepared a proposed Local Law No. L of the Year 2021 entitled: “A Local Law Further Amending Section 70-3(E) of the Town of Hyde Park Code”; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that this is a Type II action under SEQRA which does not require environmental review; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board determined that the said Local Law was acceptable in form and content for purposes of commencing the local law adoption process; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board scheduled a public hearing on the adoption of Local Law No. L of the Year 2021 on November 1, 2021, at 6:10 p.m. at the

Hyde Park Town Hall; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing was duly opened and closed on November 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that the adoption of this Local would be in the best interests of the Town of Hyde Park and its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby adopts Local Law No. L of the Year 2021 Entitled: "A Local Law Further Amending Section 70-3(E) of the Town of Hyde Park Code"; and

LOCAL LAW NO. L OF THE YEAR 2021

A LOCAL LAW FURTHER AMENDING SECTION 70-3(E) OF THE TOWN OF HYDE PARK CODE

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Hyde Park as follows:

SECTION 1. TITLE.

This Local Law shall be entitled: "A Local Law Further Amending Section 70-3(E) of the Town of Hyde Park Code".

SECTION 2. PURPOSE AND AUTHORITY.

The Town Board, pursuant to Local Law No. 2 of the Year 2021 amended certain provisions of Chapter 70 of the Town of Hyde Park Code relating to hawking and peddling licenses, which were deemed to be insufficient with regard to the forwarding of applications for investigation by the Division of Criminal Justice Services. The Town has been notified by the Division of Criminal Justice Services that they require certain additional amendments to Section 70-3(E) of the Town of Hyde Park Code.

SECTION 3.

Section 70-3(E) of the Town of Hyde Park Code is hereby deleted in its entirety and in its place a new section 70-3(E) of the Town Code is hereby enacted to read as follows:

“Licenses for hawkers and peddlers shall be issued by the Town Clerk of the Town of Hyde Park, subject to approval of the Town Board of the Town of Hyde Park. Applicants shall submit their applications to the Town Clerk of the Town of Hyde Park with all required information and a nonrefundable application fee set by the Town Board in the Town’s Fee Schedule. The Town Clerk shall forward the fingerprints of the applicants and applicable fees to the Division of Criminal Justice Services, in the form and manner as prescribed by the Division, for a search of its criminal history records, and shall review the report returned by the Division. The Town Clerk shall recommend a “yes” (approve) or “no” (deny) to the Town Board for its approval or disapproval of the application. Upon notification by the Town Board of the approval, the Town Clerk shall be authorized to issue said license after payment of the fee as hereinafter set forth. Upon notification of disapproval by the Town Board, the notice of disapproval shall be transmitted to the applicant.”

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY.

In the event that any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this article is held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalid or unconstitutional portions of this article shall be deemed severed from the article and shall in no way affect the validity of the rest of this article.

SECTION 5. SUPERSESSON.

This local law is hereby adopted pursuant to the provisions of the New York State Municipal Home Rule Law and §10 of the New York State Statute of Local Governments. It is the intent of the Town Board to supersede any provisions of the New York State Law to the extent that they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Local Law.


