With Spring comes new beginnings and all the amazing activities that go with it. It is time once again to welcome all of our many celebrations, parades, and community events with all of you. This Spring the Town has many positive changes, including the addition of two new Recreation Leaders. We are pleased to announce the addition of Morgan Sacerdote and Jamie Prinziavalli to our Staff and look forward to seeing all of the wonderful ideas they have in store for the Town.

Robert Pollard, the Town's Recreation Director along with the assistance of our newly appointed Recreation Leaders and the Hyde Park Recreation Commission worked tirelessly to ensure our community will be brought together with many new activities at Hackett Hill Park such as concerts, plays, magic shows, movies and trivia nights. The Town of Hyde Park will also have two new bus trips for our residents to enjoy.

During the last few years, town parks and trails have seen an enormous amount of use. Thanks to groundskeeper Carl Wagner and the assistance of Dave and Dan Murray, the parks continue looking great and residents have a clean, well-maintained, safe environment to enjoy. This will continue on with our newly appointed groundskeeper Gary Sabatino who will bring many years of landscaping experience to our parks. Our Recreation Staff continues to focus on improving the parks and trails and we hope you continue visiting them and utilizing all they have to offer.

In conjunction with maintaining the parks, the Town has also been moving forward with many park renovations as well. The final addition of a newly constructed playground and shaded picnic area in conjunction with ADA Accessible Parking, will complete the Dinsmore Park renovations sometime this summer. These two new additions will complement our other recent improvements which included three pickle ball courts, and a newly installed basketball court. Also slated to be completed late Spring early Summer is Hackett Hill Park's ADA Accessible and Inclusive Design Playground Equipment Project. Currently the playground equipment has been installed but the final touches to fully complete the project will include beautification of the grounds around the playground as well as newly constructed ADA Accessible Parking. Our next park renovation project is slated for Beck Park where the Town will install a new basketball court in conjunction with a newly constructed safer parking lot which will include additional ADA Accessible Parking.

The Hyde Park Trails Committee continually works diligently to maintain our trails and is currently renovating several trails within the Town of Hyde Park in partnership with the Winnakee Nature Preserve, National Park Service, Scenic Hudson, and the New York State Parks Recreation and Historic Preservation. As part of the Hyde Park Trails, the residents are encouraged to take part in the Walkabout Program. The Hyde Park Healthy Trails Walkabout is an annual program to encourage walking for health. The Walkabout is open to residents and visitors alike. Developed in partnership with the Dutchess County Department of Community and Behavioral Health, the Walkabout encourages residents to enjoy the Hyde Park's trails throughout the year -- not only for health and wellness, but also to learn about and appreciate the natural and historic landscapes that make Hyde Park such a special place to live and visit. You also earn a free sew-on patch when you complete your Walkabout Scorecard.

Last but not least, one of the Town's most favorable events, is our Music in The Parks Concert Series. The Town is delighted that this year will be the Town's 49th Annual Music in The Parks Concert Series and these wonderful concerts will continue this season at their iconic locations on the grounds at the Mills & Vanderbilt Mansions. We hope everyone can come out to enjoy some wonderful performances.
